

**Description:** CD25 is a 55 kD type I transmembrane glycoprotein also known as the low affinity

IL-2 receptor  $\alpha$  chain or Tac. It is expressed on progenitor lymphocytes, activated T and B cells, and activated monocytes/macrophages. CD25 is also expressed on a subset of non-stimulated CD4 $^+$  T cells termed T regulatory cells. CD25 associates with the IL-2 receptor  $\beta$  (CD122) and common  $\gamma$  chains (CD132) to form the high affinity IL-2R complex.
